**Methodology**

This survey of 504 Government Managers Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on May 1-15, 2024. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc.

Elites were defined as having a postgraduate degree, having a household income of more than \$150,000 annually, and living in a zip code with more than 10,000 people per square mile. Approximately 1% of the total U.S. population meets these criteria.

These parameters were determined after the observation of numerous surveys indicated that these elite segments of the population consistently exhibited views that were distinct from the general population. The sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race to reflect the demographic profile established through surveys of Registered Voters.

44% of voters in this sample were Democrats and 43% were Republicans (in both cases, these totals include leaners).

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.4 percentage points.
