of 1,000 Registered Voters Conducted August 21-22, 2024

1* When someone registers to vote, should he or she be required to show proof of citizenship?

86% Yes

10% No

4% Not sure

2* What if the only way to pass new legislation to require proof of citizenship for voting was to create a short-term government shutdown. However, after a brief shutdown, proof of citizenship would be required for voting. Would you want your representative in Congress to vote to avoid a government shutdown and have the discussion on citizenship requirements later, or to force a short-term shutdown that leads to new laws requiring proof of citizenship for voting?

48% Avoid a government shutdown and have the discussion on citizenship requirements later

43% Force a short-term shutdown that leads to new laws requiring proof of citizenship

9% Not sure

Methodology

This Counterpolling™ survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on August 21-22, 2024. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
